Qualified Supervision. It is vital that a leader be an experienced camper with strong character and common sense.

1. **Equipment.** Be completely outfitted for all weather camping. Equipment should be checked to ensure good condition for the activity and proper maintenance while in use. Scouts should be adequately clothed, and blankets/sleeping bags should be a suitable quality and weight.
TIP: Encourage youths to wear brightly colored clothing so they are more visible.
2. **Physical Fitness.** Scouts should be suitably fit for the activity. Periodic rests and engaging in other strenuous all-weather activities will help prevent accidents and overheating.
3. **Buddy System.** Having Scouts paired aids in monitoring each other's physical condition and observation of surroundings and circumstances.
4. **Planning.** Safe activities follow a plan that has been conscientiously developed for all potential weather.
TIP: Always bring a bit more food, water, and clothing than what you think you'll need.
5. **Safe Area.** Leaders should determine whether an area for winter camping is well-suited and free of hazards.
TIP: Look for dead branches in the trees overhead.

TIP: Avoid ridge tops and open areas where wind can blow down tents.
6. **Weather Check.** Weather conditions, potential hazards, and the appropriate responses should be understood and anticipated. Go to my.scouting.org for Hazardous Weather training.
7. **Burning.** Never use flames in tents, teepees, or shelters. This includes burning any solid, liquid, gel, or gas fuel; using features of tents or teepees that support stoves or fires; and use of chemical-fueled equipment and catalytic heaters.
8. **Discipline.** Rules are effective only when followed. All participants should know, understand, and respect the rules and procedures for a safe Camporee experience. Applicable rules should be discussed prior to the outing and reviewed for all participants when leaving for the Camporee.
9. **Medical.** Staff will be providing first aid on site for more advanced injuries or serious health problems. All accidents must be reported to senior staff or

the camp medic regardless of severity. Arrangements have been made for emergency evacuations, if needed.

10. **Additional Arrivals and Departures** Staff will need to be aware of any changes in attendance for all adults and youth at Camporee in the event of an emergency. Anyone arriving at or departing from Camporee, at any time during the weekend, must sign in and out at Camporee HQ

11. **Restrooms.** The Camporee will have numerous restrooms available.

Campfires are allowed – Please do not bury any ashes when extinguishing your fire they will be removed by Odom Farming!
